He teaches American History survey courses as well as upper-level and graduate courses in colonial and revolutionary America, the Atlantic World, and Early Modern Europe. He is particularly interested in religious history, popular culture, and the history of the book. Dr. Blosser's teaching and research have been supported by grants from the National Endowment for the Humanities, the American Historical Association, the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation, the Folger Shakespeare Library, the American Antiquarian Society, the Virginia Historical Society, and the Historical Society of the Episcopal Church.
