Dr. Margarita R. Ochoa is Associate Professor of History at Loyola Marymount University. She's a specialist on Latin America and her research centers on the relationship between gender relations and institutional structures of power in colonial and early-national Mexico. She is co-editor (with Dana Velasco Murillo and Mark Lentz) of *City Indians in Spain's American Empire* and is completing a manuscript, *Indigenous Mexico City*, on native communities, family relations, and gender in eighteenth and nineteenth centuries Mexico. She is also editing, with Sara Guengerich, *The Cacicas of Colonial Latin America*, a collection of essays on female indigenous leaders in Spanish America.
