Biography

Nina Mikhalevsky's areas of academic expertise and research include aesthetics, ethics and political theory, as well as women in STEM, women's education and pedagogy and the history of women's education. A tenured professor of philosophy, she was appointed provost in 2017, serving as the University's chief academic officer. Working with the deans and faculty, she provides leadership of major university initiatives in teaching, research and creative activities, and has responsibility for all university educational and academic policies.

Dr. Mikhalevsky has served in a variety of administrative positions at UMW, including vice president for strategy and policy, acting provost and interim dean of the college of education. Prior to coming to Mary Washington, she was assistant dean for academic programs and planning at the George Washington University. She also held a number of other significant administrative and leadership roles at GWU.

Named the Ambassador John M. Steeves Fellow at the Center for Strategic and International Studies, Dr. Mikhalevsky also was awarded a teaching fellowship and a university fellowship at Georgetown University. She is the recipient of the Elizabeth J. Somers Award for Outstanding Leadership in Women's Education from Mount Vernon College. She is a member of the American Philosophical Association and the American Society for Aesthetics.
