In 1973, he founded POLY-CARB, Inc., an industry-leading materials science company, which he ran as its CEO for 34 years until it was acquired by The Dow Chemical Company in 2007. Running POLY-CARB, Ratanjit developed a groundbreaking leadership and management style where there were no titles and no bosses, simply well-developed and documented values and operating principles guiding every decision made by each team member.

His pioneering work on oneness -- a timeless, universal values framework resulting in leadership from within and dramatically reduced stress -- gave him international recognition as "Mr. Stress-Free." He has authored several books including TEA: The Recipe for Stress-free Living, The Secret of Our Ultimate Success, and 101 Gems to Re-Align Our Lives. His newest book, How Oneness Changes Everything: Empowering Business Through 9 Universal Laws, is available now at www.onenessbook.com. An inspiring and motivational speaker, leadership coach and business consultant, Ratanjit has appeared on a television program that has aired in over 150 countries. Every day, he posts a new inspiring quote on Facebook, where he has thousands of fans.
